Yuchen: there were no bike observed during the first 30 minutes since it is too early for the cyclists and the weather on that day is cold as Zach said. Most of the cyclists came from South of the Monona Drive and only one bike was observed during the 2-hour period coming from E. Winequah. Also, no pedestrian was observed.
