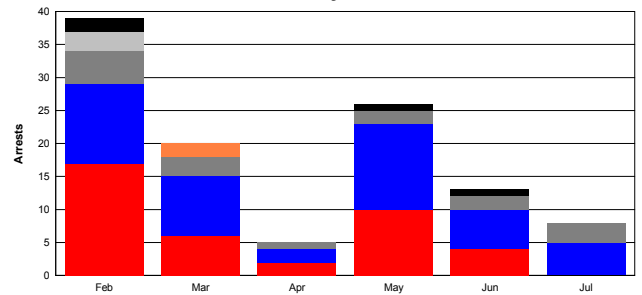

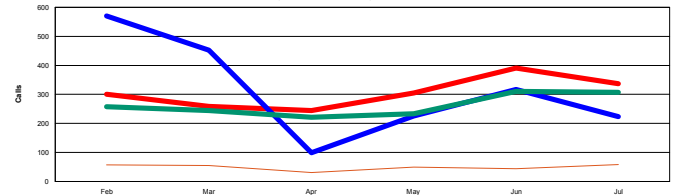
Arrests by Month

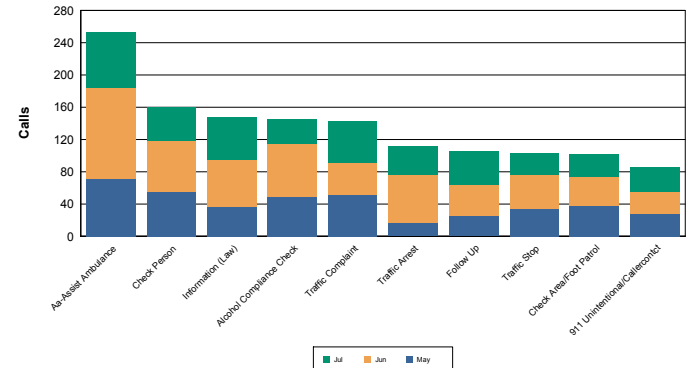

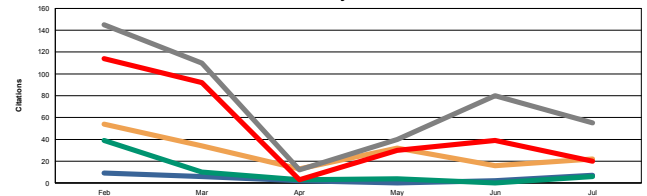

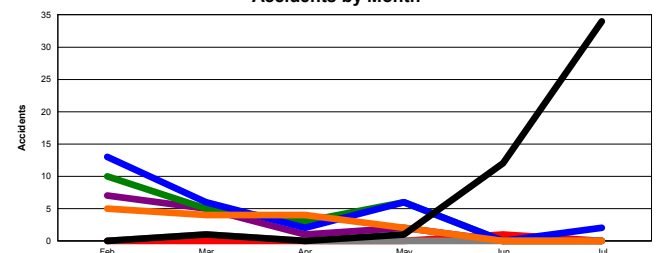

## **OPERATIONS DIVISION**

In July of 2020, the Operations Division handled 36 vehicle crashes and issued 20 traffic warnings, 55 traffic citations, and 6 parking tickets. Our calls total for July was 925 calls for service.

### **Training**

All Officers and Dispatchers attended an online 3-hour Implicit Bias training from Calibre Press.

School Resource Officer Wunsch attended several online trainings in July to include webinars on:

- School Security Measures, Racial Disparities and Implicit Racial Bias
- Police Violence, Racism, and Trauma in the School Environment
- LGBTQ+ Student's Safety Concerns in the School Environment
- Disrupting Systematic Racism in Schools
- Culturally Responsive School Town Hall Meeting

Officer Ginther attended a Wisconsin firearms instructor certification course to replace Officer James Reiter who left policing.

### **Speed Trailer**

In July the Speed Trailer was placed at the new stop sign for the bike path coming off the lake loop onto Winnequah Road June 23-July 8<sup>th</sup>, then in the 500 block of Femrite Drive July 8<sup>th</sup>—July 29<sup>th</sup>. ### **Security Checks**

Officers performed 28 security checks in the month of July. A security check is when an Officer goes into a business and walks around to meet with staff to discuss any problems that the businesses are aware of. This also serves as a deterrent for theft. For the overnight shift, this entails checking the perimeter of the business and pulling on doors to make sure the businesses are secure.

### **Retail Thefts**

There were 27 retail theft cases in July, up two from the 25 cases in June. Around 40 cases are typical in a month. These cases can be time consuming if the suspect flees and follow-up outside the City is necessary.

## **Tellurian Treatment Center**

In July we had 10 calls to the Tellurian property totaling 3 hours of police time.

### **Use of Force Incidents**

On July, 17<sup>th</sup> 2020, at 1:32 am, Officers were dispatched to a burglary in progress in the 5200 block of McKenna Road. The homeowner was alerted by their dog to two intruders entering his rear patio. Two males fled on foot upon seeing the homeowner. A responding Monona Officer observed a black Nissan Rouge SUV leaving the area at high speeds and attempted to stop the vehicle, but had to terminate the pursuit due to the suspects dangerous driving. The Nissan matched a vehicle stolen out of the north side of Madison on July 14<sup>th</sup>.

On July, 27<sup>th</sup> 2020, at 4:04 pm, Officers were dispatched to the Monona Wal-Mart for a retail theft in progress of \$222 worth of clothing. Upon arrival the first officer was informed the male refused to cooperate with the loss prevention employee and was fleeing on foot. The male spotted the squad car and continued to run from the scene and ultimately got picked up in a car. A traffic stop was performed and the car stopped and the driver pointed at the passenger and stated "he's the one you want". The passenger exited and set the merchandise down but then started to walk away. The male was told to put his arms behind his back and just continued to walk away. The Officer grabbed the man's arm and he pushed the Officer off. The Officer then drew his Taser and ordered the man several times to get on the ground, and the male kicked off his shoes (which he had just stolen) and continued to back away until the second officer arrived and grabbed the male and then both could go hands on to place the male into handcuffs.

On July, 30<sup>th</sup> 2020, at 7:58 pm, a Monona Officer was requested for mutual aid for the Town of Madison PD to assist with a domestic disturbance where the suspect just fled on foot. The City of Madison assisted with a K9 track. While searching for the suspect, dispatch advised the male returned to the original location of the domestic. The Officers observed the suspect and ordered him to the ground and he refused. Each officer grabbed an arm and the male resisted and tried to pull away, so he was lowered to the ground for handcuffing. The male was secured into a squad car and our officer cleared from this call.

## 1<sup>st</sup> Shift Monthly Report

On the evening of July, 5<sup>th</sup> 2020, at 11:53 pm, Officers were dispatched to Falcon Circle for a report of shots fired. Officers located 24 shell casings in the roadway from 5 different caliber firearms. I attached the photos of the house which was struck by several of those bullets. The incident had nothing to do with the 87-year old Monona resident or her house, rather she was an innocent victim of the ever increasing Dane County gun violence. (MO20-06272)



On July, 25<sup>th</sup> 2020, at 10:33 am, Officers were dispatched to the 6300 block of Bridge Road for a report of a truck that crashed into a tree in one yard, then drove in a circle and struck a house across the street. The crash was suspected to be a result of huffing compressed air. The driver was arrested for a probation violation and charges for OWI are pending test results. (MO20-06876)

## **2nd Shift**

Here is the second shift activity report for the month of July. Officers conducted 12 traffic stops. We handled 18 Retail Thefts, and 22 crashes. We also made 3 OWI arrests.

The following are some of the cases second shift handled this month.

On July 7 at about 3:30 pm Officers were dispatched to the beltline and Monona Drive for a weapons complaint. The caller advised that a firearm was displayed at him while travelling west on USH 12. The suspect vehicle was located and stopped in the City of Madison with the assistance of the Madison Police. An investigation was conducted and no firearm was located.

On July 9 at about 4:30 pm Officers were dispatched to the area of Monona Drive and Kings Row for a disturbance. Dispatch advised that a male subject was chasing another male dressed in drag. While Officers responded the two subjects ran to the 6200 block of East Gate Road. One of them ran into an apartment building. Officers located one of them in the basement hiding and the other standing out front. During the investigation it was discovered that a theft of a purse occurred on July 4<sup>th</sup> at Tully's but was never initially reported. The subject who was found hiding was the suspect. The victim happened to see the suspect at Kwik Trip and confronted him. The suspect was charged with theft and felony bail jumping. The suspect also had warrants.

On July 22 at about 10:40 pm Officers were dispatched to the 200 block of St Teresa for a disturbance. Officers arrived on scene to see a father restraining his son. During the investigation it was determined that the son had left the residence that morning when he wasn't supposed to. When the son got home he pulled a knife out on his father and threatened him. The son was arrested and taken to a detention center.

On July 23 at about 8:30 pm Officers were dispatched to the 6200 block of East Gate Road for two men arguing in the back parking lot. Upon arrival Officers made contact with the two subjects. They were arguing about money because one of them purchased a TV from the other but never paid him.

### **3rd Shift**

During the month of July, third shift officers for the Monona Police Department focused on patrolling the residential and business districts. Officers responded to several disturbance and intoxicated person's calls for service during the month of July.

On July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 11:53 pm, officers responded to the 400 block of Falcon Circle, for a loud explosion. Officers arrived on scene and located 24 shell casings, ranging from handgun casings to .223 rifle casings in the roadway. It was later determined that bullets had struck a couple residences on the 400 block of Falcon Circle. The investigation is ongoing.

On July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 1:29 am, officers responded to a hit and run crash in the parking lot of Tully's II bar. The bartender reported that a silver SUV had struck the fence in the parking lot and left the property. Officers located the suspect vehicle occupied in the parking lot of 320 W. Broadway. The driver of the vehicle was arrested for OWI 2<sup>nd</sup> offense, with a B.A.C. of .32 g/210L.

On July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 1:32 am, officers responded to a residence on the 5200 block of McKenna Road for a burglary in progress. The homeowner had been alerted by their dog who was barking at two intruders who had entered the residence and fled out the back patio door. Responding officers located a suspect vehicle, which fled from officers who

terminated their pursuit due to the high rate of speed. Officers recognized the vehicle to match that of a recent stolen automobile out of the City of Madison. Officers collected evidence from the scene and identified a possible suspect. The case was forwarded to the detective division.

On July 28<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 2:51 am, officers responded to the 4800 block of Monona Drive for an intoxicated individual. The officers determined that the subject was incapacitated and was taken into protective custody. He was transported to a local hospital then to detox. A p.b.t showed the suspect had a B.A.C. of .34 g/210L.

Members of the Investigative Unit were assigned to, or assisted with, the investigation of 17 current and past incidents.

### **Current Investigations**

#### **MO20-05915 – ARMED ROBBERY/SHOTS FIRED**

The department investigated an armed robbery at a local hotel. At the end of the robbery, the suspect fired a round towards the victim. Detectives conducted interviews, served legal process on multiple entities and are awaiting returns.

#### **MO20-06272 – SHOTS FIRED**

Officers responded to a shots fired call and found that two houses and a car had been struck by gunfire. One house was struck by about 15 bullets. Shell casings from five

different calibers of firearms were recovered at the scene. Detectives assisted with processing the scene and communicating with other departments who had similar incidents. Evidence has been submitted to the crime lab for processing.

#### **MO20-06090 – DEATH INVESTIGATION**

Detectives assisted DCI with a death investigation where a man was found deceased in the water. DCI took the lead on this investigation.

#### **MO20-06684 – BURGLARY/THEFT OF GUN**

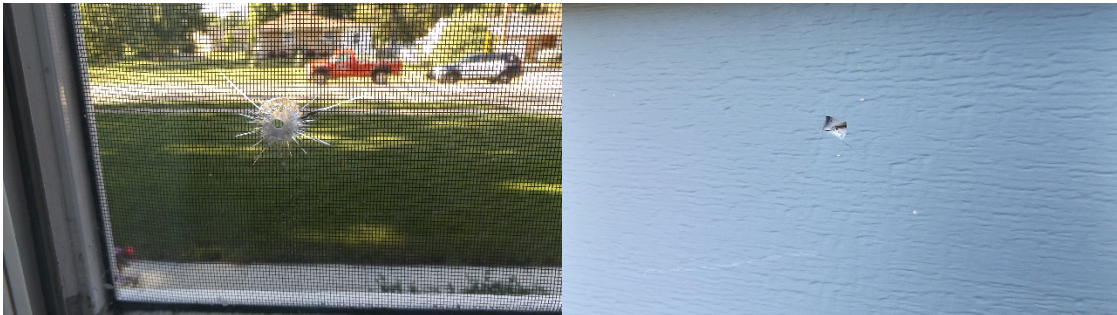
Two residents were out of town for a long weekend. Upon returning home, they discovered their residence had been broken into. A gun and iPhone were stolen. Detectives assisted with recovery of the stolen phone. The gun is still missing and was listed in NCIC as a stolen.

#### **MO20-06228 SEXUAL ASSAULTS**

This was a report of sexual assault allegations by one male adult against two juvenile females in the 600 block of Bartels Street. During the follow-up investigation, both victims stopped cooperating with detectives. The accused male cooperated with the investigation. There is no evidence to support the assault that was alleged occurred.

#### **MO20-06688 DAMAGE TO PROPERTY**

On 07-19-20, a residential home in the 800 block of W. Dean Avenue, was shot at with a BB gun during daylight hours. The pellets caused damage estimated in the thousands. The homeowner was home during this incident and immediately notified police. A suspect was developed and identified, confirming the suspect targeted the resident. Charges have been forwarded to the Dane County District Attorney's Office.

## **Citation and Arrest Statistics**

During the month of July, the Monona Police issued numerous traffic citations, municipal ordinance (non-traffic) citations, parking citations and warnings. In addition, there were many referrals for charges. See the detail below.

Each of the adult and juvenile arrests and referrals take at least an hour of the Dispatchers' time to complete the reports and intake paperwork for the Dane County District Attorney's Office. Once completed these forms and reports are reviewed by the Investigations Lieutenant before submitting them to the DA's Office. Each of these submissions is reviewed for referral to the Dane County Community Restorative Court (CRC). CRC is a program to address youthful offenders, age 17 – 25, with little or no Criminal History in a restorative justice model as an alternative to formal criminal charges. The CRC Referrals line above shows the number of Adult Arrests & Referrals who qualified to participate in CRC. Offenders who fail to complete CRC are referred back to the DA's Office for formal charging.

## **Dispatch**

The Monona Communications Center answers business line calls for Police, Fire, and EMS incidents. Calls for service for Fire and EMS are transferred to the Dane County Communications Center for dispatching of Monona Fire and EMS personnel. The Monona Communications Center advises Police of high priority Fire and EMS calls in the event Officer Response is required. Many of the business line calls include routine phone calls from citizens who are not only seeking police assistance, but also assistance with processing citation payments, requesting police records and general assistance. The dispatchers are also responsible for preparing and filing officer reports, citations, accidents, parking, UCR reporting and many other routine daily duties.

During the month of July, Dispatchers handled 925 calls for service. Most of these calls for service were received on the non-emergency lines, via personal reporting at the Police Department, transfers from the Dane County Communications Center or as self-initiated calls directly from Monona Officers.
