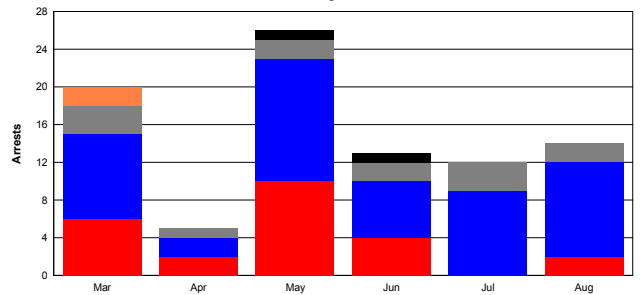

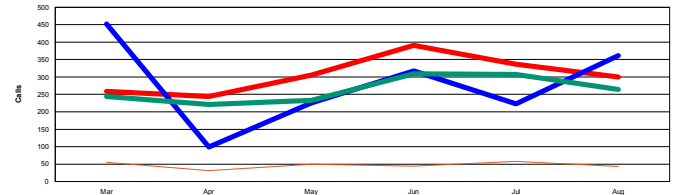
Arrests by Month

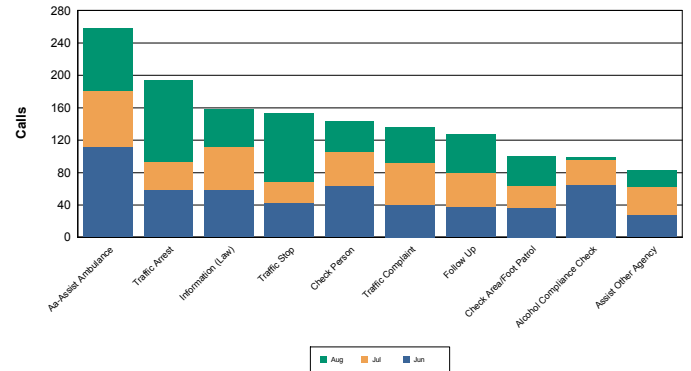

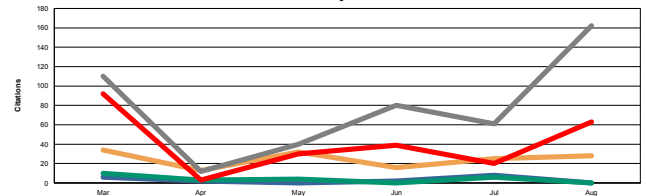

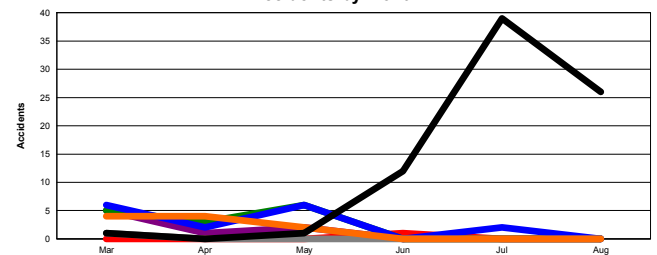

OPERATIONS DIVISION

In August of 2020, the Operations Division handled 26 vehicle crashes and issued 63 traffic warnings, 162 traffic citations, and 0 parking tickets. Our calls total for August was 968 calls for service.

Training

All Officers and dispatchers attended a 3-hour training on *Implicit Bias: Understanding its Impact on Actions and Decisions*

Lt. Wiegel and Community Relations Officer Reynolds attended a 1.5-hour training on *Understanding Implicit and Explicit Bias*.

Officer Ginther and Officer Franca attended a 40-hour *Crisis Intervention Team (CIT)* training taught by the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Dane County.

Security Checks

Officers performed 36 security checks in the month of August. A security check is when an Officer goes into a business and walks around to meet with staff to discuss any problems that the businesses are aware of. This also serves as a deterrent for theft. For the overnight shift, this entails checking the perimeter of the business and pulling on doors to make sure the businesses are secure.

Retail Thefts

There were 23 retail theft cases in August, down a couple from the 27 cases in July. Around 40 cases are typical in a month. These cases can be time consuming if the suspect flees and follow-up outside the City is necessary.

Tellurian Treatment Center

In August we had 11 calls to the Tellurian property totaling 13 hours of police time.

Citizen Complaints

There were no citizen complaints in August.

Use of Force Incidents

On August 1st, 2020 at 1:00 am an officer observed a car traveling 86 MPH on the beltline. An attempt to stop the vehicle was made but the suspect fled at even higher speeds, so the Officer terminated. (MO20-07055) (Suspect not identified)

On August 1st, 2020 at 2:05 am an officer observed a car traveling 89 MPH on the beltline. An attempt to stop the vehicle was made but the suspect fled at even higher speeds, so the Officer terminated. (MO20-07060) (Suspect not identified)

On August 13th, 2020 at 12:30 am an officer observed a car traveling 75 MPH on the 45 MPH area of HWY 51 in Monona. An attempt to stop the vehicle was made but the suspect fled at even higher speeds, so the Officer terminated. (MO20-07398) (Suspect not identified)

On August 14th, 2020 at 12:25 am an officer assisted the Town of Madison with a traffic stop which initially pulled over by the Wal-Mart. The Town Officer called out that the vehicle was fleeing and the driver was very intoxicated. A Town Officer was able to use tire deflation sticks but the driver fled west on the beltline. Our Officer followed to assist the Town, and the car eventually came to a stop after losing a tire. A High Risk stop was performed and the driver was taken into custody without issue. (MO20-07456) (M/B 32)

On August 15th, 2020 at 12:35 am an officer observed a car traveling 104 MPH on the beltline. No stop was attempted at this time. This vehicle was spotted in residential streets of McFarland doing 75 MPH - 100 MPH and that officer lost sight of it. The vehicle returned to the beltline and was again seen traveling in excess of 100 MPH. A stop was attempted at this time however no one was in position with tire deflation devices so the pursuit was terminated. (MO20-07497) (Suspect not identified)

On August 18th, 2020 at 12:56 am an officer observed a Capitol Officer in a pursuit of a vehicle northbound on Monona Drive. Our Officer followed to assist and the pursuit turned onto Acacia Lane and the Capitol Officer terminated the pursuit. (MO20-07579) (Suspect not identified)

On August 21st, 2020 at 11:01 pm an officer observed a car traveling 98 MPH on the beltline. An attempt to stop the vehicle was made but the suspect fled at even higher speeds, so the Officer terminated. This car fled a deputy at 11:56 pm and struck tire deflation sticks but the Office lost sight of the car. Fitchburg located the car at 12:09 am unoccupied. (MO20-07719) (Suspect not identified)

1st Shift

On August 19th at 9:42 am Officers were dispatched to the Walgreens for a male passenger in a car in the parking lot who looked “messed up”. Upon arrival the subject was breathing but not responsive. The subject was transported to a local hospital for an

overdose. The vehicle contained numerous pieces of drug paraphernalia as well as 1.7 grams of methamphetamine and Lorazepam. Charges are pending. (MO20-07634)

2nd Shift

Here is the second shift activity report for the month of August. Officers conducted 34 traffic stops, handled 19 Retail Thefts, and 21 traffic crashes.

The following are some of the cases second shift handled this month.

On August 6th Officers responded to the 400 block of Falcon Circle for a domestic disturbance. It was reported that the male who lives there was freaking out and throwing things. Once Officers arrived on scene they discovered that the male had fled in a vehicle. After conducting their investigation charges of Disorderly Conduct were developed for the male.

On August 19th Officers responded to the 3800 block of Monona Drive for a theft. Officers met with the complainant who advised that someone had cut the lock and stole his canoe from a rack. The investigation continues.

On August 25th Officer responded to the 2500 block of Royal Avenue for a report of a subject "huffing". The first officer arrived on scene and made contact with the suspect who was passed out with an aerosol can in his hand. The Officer checked on the subject who is known to officers from several past same incidents. The subject became combative and briefly fought with officers. He was taken to the Dane County Jail on several charges.

On August 31st Officers responded to the intersection of Bjelde and Tompkins for a fight in progress. Officers were advised that two people were fighting. Upon arrival Officers learned that both subjects knew each other. Apparently one of them became upset when the other kept texting him. One of the subject's texted back to meet him outside. They began to argue and a physical fight ensued. Officers issued citations for Battery and Disorderly Conduct.

3rd Shift

The Monona Police Department third shift officers made 63 traffic stops in the month of August. Of those 63 traffic stops, 23 were issued citations while 40 received warnings. Officers responded to 1 traffic accident, and arrested 3 individuals with active arrest warrants while responding to several disturbance calls.

On August 14th, 2020 at 12:23 a.m. officers assisted the Town of Madison Police Department and Dane County Sheriff's Department with a vehicle pursuit that had come into the City of Monona. The Town of Madison Police Department had attempted to stop an intoxicated driver that pulled into Wal-Mart. After initially stopping the vehicle fled and was pursued by a Dane County deputy. The vehicles speeds were slowed due to a

successful stop sticks deployment on HWY 12 at Broadway. Once the vehicle came to a stop officers assisted with a high risk traffic stop where the operator was taken into custody.

On August 15th, 2020 at 12:34 a.m. an officer observed a vehicle speeding, 104 mph in a 55 mph zone. The vehicle eluded the officer and the pursuit was terminated after 2 miles. The officer was not able to obtain a registration plate on the suspect vehicle.

On August 16th, 2020 at 6:06 a.m. a resident on Woody Lane, discovered her vehicle had been stolen from her residence between 12 a.m. and 5 a.m. On August 18th, 2020 the vehicle was recovered by the City of Madison Police at an apartment complex. Video was obtained of the suspects whom have been identified. The case has been forwarded to the detective division.

On August 22nd, 2020 at 2:05 a.m. a vehicle was stopped for speeding, 78 mph in a 55 mph zone. During the officers initial contact with the driver officers detected the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. A search of the vehicle was conducted where officers located a loaded 9mm glock handgun, marijuana, a large amount of U.S. currency along with packaging for drugs. The operator was arrested and taken to the Dane County Jail on possession with intent to deliver marijuana and carrying a concealed weapon charges.

Members of the Investigative Unit were assigned to, or assisted with, the investigation of 9 current and past incidents.

Current Investigations

MO20-06684 – BURGLARY/THEFT OF GUN

Two residents were out of town for a long weekend. Upon returning home, they discovered their residence had been broken into, and a gun and iPhone were stolen. Detectives were able to assist with getting the stolen phone back. The gun is still missing, and is listed in the TIME system as a stolen weapon.

MO20-05915 – ARMED ROBBERY/SHOTS FIRED

The department investigated an armed robbery at a local hotel. At the end of the robbery, the suspect fired a round towards the victim. Detectives conducted interviews and served legal process on multiple entities and are awaiting returns.

MO20-07613 – THEFT

Patrol requested assistance with locating a stolen cell phone believed to have been taken by a porch pirate. Detectives were able to locate the phone, return it to the owner, and determined there was no criminal activity.

MO20-08026 - CHILD PORNOGRAPHY

Our department received a complaint that a Monona resident has allegedly been viewing child pornography. The reporting person did not provide enough information to further the investigation through legal means. The investigation is inactive pending further investigatory leads or further evidence.

MO20-07525 – STOLEN AUTO

Patrol took a report of a stolen vehicle, which was recovered a few days later by MPD. Detectives collected property and evidence from the vehicle and are working on returning stolen property to victims. Suspects have been identified after they were captured on video in Madison committing other related property crimes.



MO20-07634 DRUGS AND STOLEN PROPERTY CRIMES

Detectives were called out to assist officers who were out with two subjects who were believed to have overdosed on drugs in a vehicle. The vehicle contained a large amount of suspected stolen property which was seized pending further investigation. One of the suspects was transported for medical treatment. The other involved subject denied that any of the property belonged to him.

Citation and Arrest Statistics

During the month of August, the Monona Police issued numerous traffic citations, municipal ordinance (non-traffic) citations, parking citations and warnings. In addition, there were many referrals for charges. See the detail below.

Each of the adult and juvenile arrests and referrals take at least an hour of the Dispatchers' time to complete the reports and intake paperwork for the Dane County District Attorney's Office. Once completed these forms and reports are reviewed by the Investigations Lieutenant before submitting them to the DA's Office. Each of these submissions is reviewed for referral to the Dane County Community Restorative Court (CRC). CRC is a program to address youthful offenders, age 17 – 25, with little or no Criminal History in a restorative justice model as an alternative to formal criminal charges. The CRC Referrals line above shows the number of Adult Arrests & Referrals who qualified to participate in CRC. Offenders who fail to complete CRC are referred back to the DA's Office for formal charging.

Dispatch

The Monona Communications Center answers business line calls for Police, Fire, and EMS incidents. Calls for service for Fire and EMS are transferred to the Dane County Communications Center for dispatching of Monona Fire and EMS personnel. The Monona Communications Center advises Police of high priority Fire and EMS calls in the event an Officer Response is required. Many of the business line calls include routine phone calls from citizens who are not only seeking police assistance, but also assistance with processing citation payments, requesting police records and general assistance. The dispatchers are also responsible for preparing and filing officer reports, citations, accidents, parking, UCR reporting and many other routine daily duties.

During the month of August, Dispatchers handled 968 calls for service. Most of these calls for service were received on the non-emergency lines, via personal reporting at the Police Department, transfers from the Dane County Communications Center or as self-initiated calls directly from Monona Officers.
