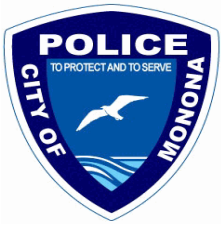

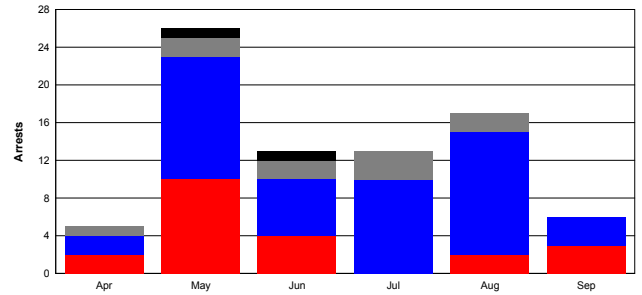

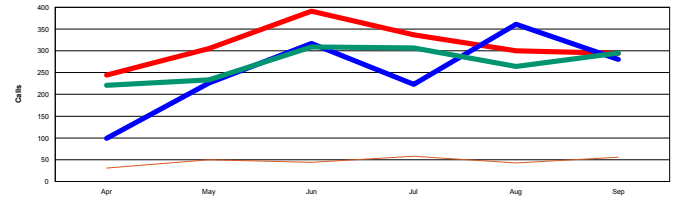
Arrests by Month

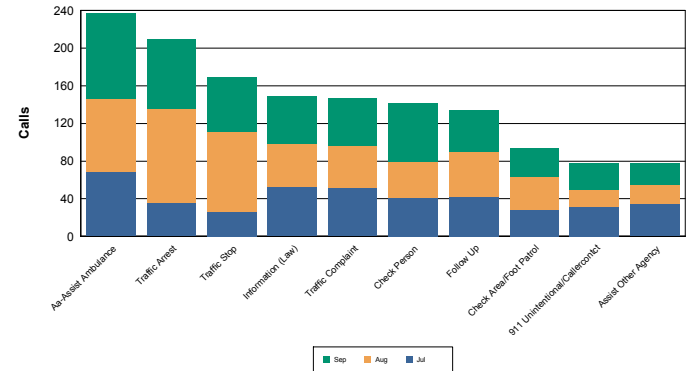

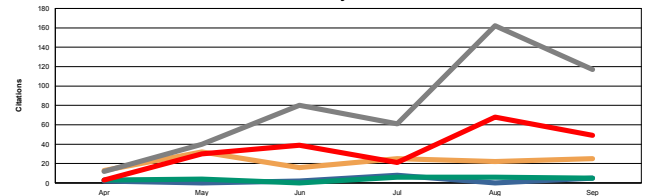

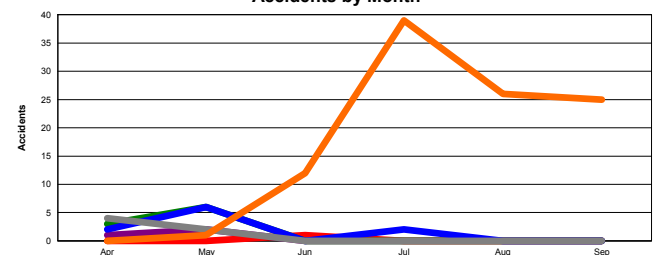

OPERATIONS DIVISION

In September of 2020, the Operations Division handled 25 vehicle crashes and issued 49 traffic warnings, 117 traffic citations, and 5 parking tickets. Our calls total for September was 925 calls for service.

Security Checks

Officers performed 30 security checks in the month of September. A security check is when an Officer goes into a business and walks around to meet with staff to discuss any problems that the businesses are aware of. This also serves as a deterrent for theft. For the overnight shift, this entails checking the perimeter of the business and pulling on doors to make sure the businesses are secure.

Retail Thefts

There were 20 retail theft cases in September, down a few from the 23 cases in August. Around 40 cases are typical in a month. These cases can be time consuming if the suspect flees and follow-up outside the City is necessary.

Tellurian Treatment Center

In September, we had 4 calls to the Tellurian property totaling 1 hour of police time.

Citizen Complaints

On September 23rd there was a walk-in complaint from a male attending the protest at the Monona Library parking lot, wishing to make a complaint that his traffic stop from February 24 of 2020, where he was given a warning for non-registration and suspended license, was part of racial profiling. The man was given a complaint form and to date, has not returned a signed complaint. The man's registration expired May 31, 2018, and as of this monthly report, it is still expired, and he has never had a driver's license.

1st Shift Monthly Report

On September 3rd, 2020, at 7 am, an Officer was dispatched to a report of a female smashing a car window with a golf club, and swinging it at a male. It is believed that this was some kind of domestic dispute, but the 19-year-old female claimed she was just angry and the male was trying to calm her down and when he could not, he left and she took out her anger on her own car. The other half of the incident never made a report so her version of the event is the only one of which we are aware. (MO20-08082)



On September 10th, 2020, at 7:47 am, an Officer was dispatched to a business in the industrial park for a theft of copper wire and LP tanks from the business property. The Detective Division was able to identify both suspects from sharing photos from the business surveillance video with other Dane Co. police agencies. The investigation is ongoing. (MO20-08316)

Use of Force Incidents

On September 5th, 2020 at 11:10 am Officers were dispatched to the Menards store for a retail theft in progress. The store got the property back and the suspects left in a vehicle and one left on foot. A responding Officer observed the suspect on foot and as he approached the male ran away. The male hopped a fence and then appeared to be hiding in some bushes with his hands covered. The Officer gave the suspect commands at gun point but the male fled again into a wooded area. A K9 track led to a garbage can with some drugs and drug paraphernalia in it, but the male was not located. Another person stopped as part of this theft gave up the name of the male who fled, and he had 3 warrants out for his arrest. (MO20-08162) Suspect: M/W, 36

On September 7th, 2020 at 3:42 am an Officer observed a vehicle traveling 71 MPH in a 45 MPH zone. A stop was attempted but the driver made some evasive turns onto East Broadway. The Officer terminated but continued to check the area. Shortly thereafter, the Officer observed some headlights behind a closed business. The Officer investigated and the same vehicle was fleeing across a grassy area. A second unit picked up the suspect car and attempted to stop it. The vehicle came to a stop in a residential area and the driver fled on foot. A perimeter was set up and a K9 track was attempted but it was not successful. The vehicle was towed from the scene. (MO20-08215) Suspect not identified.

On September 7th, 2020 at 11:14 pm an Officer observed a car traveling on HWY 51 at 76 MPH. A stop was attempted but the vehicle fled at speeds over 85 MPH and it ran a red light, so the Officer terminated the pursuit.
(MO20-08250) Suspect not identified.

On September 7th, 2020 at 11:21 pm a second Officer observed a different vehicle speeding, 81 MPH in a 55 MPH zone. A stop was attempted but the car fled at speeds over 100 MPH. The Officer terminated the pursuit.
(MO20-08251) Suspect not identified.

On September 10th, 2020 at 9:01 pm Officers were dispatched to a duplex on Roselawn Avenue for a report of a female who screamed after what sounded like a single gunshot. Upon arrival, Officers observed a single unused round of handgun ammunition on the front step of the duplex, and a cavalry style sword was located in the yard. One male attempted to flee out the back and was detained by police and a second person was found hiding in the yard. The detained males refused to cooperate with the investigation. Multiple subjects were seen inside the duplex who became verbally hostile towards police presence. To de-escalate the situation and allow for a thorough search, a search warrant was obtained. At 1:03 am entry was made into the residence with the assistance of McFarland, Dane County, and Town of Madison Officers. Three handguns, a spent shell casing and a hole in the wall consistent with a handgun being fired were all located inside the duplex.

On September 12th, 2020 at 11:15 pm Officers were dispatched to Kwik Trip by a subject identifying a car in the lot as a stolen auto. While enroute, dispatch was able to verify the plate given by the caller was to a stolen auto matching the description of the auto in question. As the Officer pulled in the stolen auto was leaving. The Officer pulled in front of the auto with his emergency lights operating and spot light on the driver. The driver then exited the car and attempted to flee on foot. The Officer pursued on foot and got ahold of the male and decentralized him to the ground. The Officer turned over the male to a Dane County Deputy who took the stolen auto report two hours earlier, and our Officer forwarded charges of resisting arrest to the DA's office.

On September 13th, 2020 at 8:57 pm Officers heard a Dane County Deputy in pursuit of a stolen auto on Pflaum Road heading towards Monona. County next aired the vehicle was disabled at Walgreens and 6 subjects were fleeing the vehicle on foot. As the Officer was almost on scene, he observed one suspect running across Nichols Road towards Gunderson's. The Officer engaged in a foot pursuit yelling commands for the male to stop. The Officer then un-holstered his Taser and ordered the male to stop, as the male jumped a fence. The Officer searched the area and located the male hiding under a car parked in a driveway. The male was ordered out at Taser point and placed into handcuffs without further issue. The male was turned over to the Deputy on scene.

On September 13th, 2020 at 1:12 am Officers monitoring the County radio heard a Maple Bluff Officer following a stolen auto onto the southbound interstate. Our Officer observed the vehicle on Stoughton Road. The Officer attempted to stop the vehicle, but it fled in a reckless manner and the officer terminated the pursuit.
(MO20-08454) Suspect not identified.

On September 16th, 2020 at 4:13 pm an Officer observed a male walking who seemed impaired, and is a known alcoholic. The male entered a local gas station and was attempting to steal some chewing tobacco as the officer made entry. The male briefly attempted to run but the officer got ahold of him. The male struggled with the Officer for a moment but a second Officer arrived on scene and they were able to secure the man into handcuffs. The male blew a .19 into a PBT. The subject was checked over by EMS and then issued a citation for retail theft and resisting arrest.

On September 24th, 2020 at 6:35 pm Officers were dispatched to Wal-Mart for a retail theft in progress. The Officer and suspect observed each other in the parking lot and the male walked away refusing to stop. The male took off running and a brief foot pursuit occurred, with the officer telling the suspect several times to stop, police. The suspect then stopped and turned around and faced the officer. The Officer then drew his Taser and ordered the suspect to the ground. The male complied and was placed into handcuffs without further incident. The male was cited for retail theft and resisting arrest.

On September 29th, 2020 at 4:00 pm Officers were dispatched to the Beltline for a possible overdose. Upon arrival the Officer observed a person performing chest compressions next to the passenger side of the stopped car. EMS loaded the male into the ambulance and administered two doses of Narcan. The male then fled out of the ambulance near Park Street even though he was not wearing shoes or a shirt at this point. Officers searched the area and located the male as he attempted to close a garage door to hide in a random residence. The Officer drew his Taser and ordered the male out. The male complied and was placed into handcuffs without further issue. The male was then medically cleared at a hospital. The male's probation agent out of South Dakota was quite displeased that the suspect was in WI without permission and told this male he had until 5 pm the next day to show up in his office or his probation would be revoked. Our Officer cited the male for obstructing.

On September 30th, 2020 at 4:03 pm Officers were dispatched to Wal-Mart for a retail theft in progress. The responding Officer observed the loss prevention employee chasing a male towards the underground parking lot, where the suspect was attempting to enter a vehicle. The Officer drew his Taser and yelled "don't do it". The suspect then complied and was escorted back to the LP Office where he was arrested for retail theft and taken to jail on a probation hold.

2nd Shift

Officers conducted 48 traffic stops. We handled 13 Retail Thefts, 2 OWIs, and 10 vehicle crashes.

The following are some of the cases second shift handled this month:

On September 7th at about 4:30 pm Officers responded to the skate park for a disturbance. A caller reported that he was beaten up. Upon arrival, Officers spoke to two subjects who were involved in a physical altercation. During the investigation, Officers learned that this fight started over a person at the skate park playing music loudly. A person playing tennis did not care for the lyrics of the songs. The two exchanged words and a fight ensued. A citation was issued.

On September 10th at about 9:00pm Officers were dispatched to the 6300 block of Roselawn for a possible shot fired and a woman screaming. Upon arrival a live round was discovered on the porch and a broken cell phone. Contact was attempted at the residence. No one would answer the door but it was evident a party was occurring inside. Two subjects attempted to flee out the back and were taken into custody. A search warrant was obtained for the residence. Several more people were detained. Three firearms were recovered from the residence. The investigation continues.

On September 11th at about 4:10 pm a vehicle was reported stolen from the parking lot of South Towne Mall. An Officer made contact with the caller who advised that her vehicle was stolen. The victim advised that she was in a store for about ten minutes and when she returned her car was gone. The victim still had the keys to her car. On September 17th, the victim contacted the Monona Police and advised that she found her vehicle.

3rd Shift

During the month of September, third shift officers for the Monona Police Department conducted 44 traffic stops resulting in 2 OWI arrests. Of those 44 traffic stops, 29 were given warnings while 15 were issued citations. Officers had 5 different incidents where they attempted to initiate a traffic stop on vehicles for a traffic violation only to have it engage in a vehicle pursuit where officers terminated shortly thereafter.

On September 1st, 2020 at 11:27 pm, officers responded to a noise disturbance in the parking lot of 6206 East Gate Road. Responding officers arrived and located a vehicle exiting the parking lot with loud music/bass. The operator who officers recognized from previous contacts at this address quickly exited the vehicle and returned to the apartment complex. Further investigation determined the vehicle was stolen through the City of Fond Du Lac. The suspect was apprehended inside the apartment complex and transported to the Dane County Jail.

On September 5th, 2020 at 2:06 am, officers responded to a battery complaint at the Silver Eagle. The investigation determined that the bouncer and bartender attempted to stop a female patron from leaving the bar with open alcohol. During this contact, the patron and her friends started to strike the bouncer and bartender causing minor injuries. The suspects fled the scene prior to police arrival. The investigation is ongoing.

On September 9th, 2020 at 1:38 am, an officer observed a vehicle parked up on a curb on the 6200 block of Monona Drive. The operator of the vehicle was arrested for OWI 5th offense. A search warrant was obtained for a legal blood draw. Those results indicated the operator had a B.A.C. of .08.

On September 12th, 2020 at 11:15 pm, officers responded to Kwik Trip for a report of a stolen vehicle in the parking lot. Arriving officers located the vehicle as it began to leave the parking lot and activated their emergency lights. The vehicle stopped and the driver started to run away on foot. Officers pursued the driver and were able to take him into custody. The driver was taken to the Dane County Jail.

On September 14th, 2020, officers took reports of two automobiles that had been stolen overnight. The first vehicle was stolen on the 6300 block of Roselawn Avenue. The second vehicle was stolen from the 200 block of St. Teresa Terrace. The vehicles were entered as stolen. Both vehicle have since been recovered.

On September 16th, 2020, at 4:12 am, officers responded to a residential fire at 1406 Mathys Road. Officers assisted fire and suspected that the incident was an arson. The detective division took over the investigation and is still ongoing.

On September 17th, 2020 at 11:00 pm, an officer attempted to stop a vehicle for dangerous and reckless driving. The vehicle fled from the officer and crashed on Moorland Road at South Towne Drive. The driver of the vehicle refused to cooperate with officer's commands and a Taser was deployed. Shortly after the officer heard a single gunshot from the vehicle. Assisting officers arrived on scene and made contact at the vehicle and observed a male with a gunshot wound to the head. Officers attempted life saving measures but the suspect was pronounced deceased at the scene. DCI was called to investigate the incident. Their investigation is ongoing.

On September 18th, 2020 at 2:28 am, officers responded to a vehicle accident on the 4700 block of Winnequah Road. The investigation determined that a vehicle was traveling on Winnequah Road and struck a parked vehicle. The operator of the vehicle was arrested for OWI 1st offense.

Members of the Investigative Unit were assigned to, or assisted with, the investigation of 16 current and past incidents.

Current Investigations

MO20-08316 – THEFT

A local business had multiple large propane tanks stolen from their business. Detectives sent out a crime alert with photos of the suspects and are investigating potential leads.

MO20-08563 – CHILD ABUSE

A parent was concerned about injuries she believed her child received at day care. Monona Detectives worked with CPS on this case and a medical exam was conducted on the child. Criminal charges in this case are not likely.

MO20-08683 – CHILD ABUSE

An alleged abuse of a child occurred at a local retail store. Detectives worked with Dane County CPS to insure the safety of the children involved. A safe harbor interview with the victim was conducted. The suspect turned himself in for a probation violation and criminal charges have been referred to the DA's Office.

MO20-08401 – INJURY CRASH

Detectives assisted in the investigation of a serious crash where a pedestrian was struck on the beltline and injuries were initially believed to be life threatening. Search warrant were obtained and served on multiple vehicles with the help of the WI State Patrol Technical Reconstruction Unit. The victim's condition was upgraded and he was released after multiple days in the hospital. Evidence has been collected and Detectives are working with WSP on this incident. The investigation is still ongoing and criminal charges in this case are likely.

MO20-08317 - DEATH INVESTIGATION

A Detective was called out to an apartment in the 5700 block of Monona Drive for a death investigation involving the use of a firearm. It was determined nothing criminal occurred to cause the death and the investigation was closed.

MO20-08628 - DEATH INVESTIGATION

A detective was called to assist with the investigation after a pursuit and vehicle crash where the driver, and lone occupant, died as the result of a gunshot wound. No Officers discharged their firearm during the incident. In the interest of transparency, this case was turned over to the WI Department of Criminal Investigations to investigate.

MO20-08551 – ARSON INVESTIGATION

Detectives were called to a residential fire on Mathys Road due to the suspicious nature of the fire. State Arson investigators were called and after obtaining a warrant, detectives processed the fire scene with fire investigators from WI DOJ, DCI and ATF. Evidence was collected and is being processed. The incident is still under investigation and the referral of criminal charges is pending the outcome of the investigation.

MO20-08337 - SHOT FIRED

A Detective was called to a duplex in the 6300 block of Roselawn Avenue where a single gunshot occurred inside. Multiple persons from the residence were detained but uncooperative. Detectives obtained a search warrant and entry was executed. A single bullet hole was found in a wall, along with one empty shell casing. There were also three handguns hidden in the residence which were seized as evidence. No one was injured during the incident and involved parties are still not cooperating. The case remains under investigation.

Citation and Arrest Statistics

During the month of September, the Monona Police issued numerous traffic citations, municipal ordinance (non-traffic) citations, parking citations and warnings. In addition, there were many referrals for charges. See the detail below.

Each of the adult and juvenile arrests and referrals take at least an hour of the Dispatchers' time to complete the reports and intake paperwork for the Dane County District Attorney's Office. Once completed these forms and reports are reviewed by the Investigations Lieutenant before submitting them to the DA's Office. Each of these submissions is reviewed for referral to the Dane County Community Restorative Court (CRC). CRC is a program to address youthful offenders, age 17 – 25, with little or no Criminal History in a restorative justice model as an alternative to formal criminal charges. The CRC Referrals line above shows the number of Adult Arrests & Referrals who qualified to participate in CRC. Offenders who fail to complete CRC are referred back to the DA's Office for formal charging.

Dispatch

The Monona Communications Center answers business line calls for Police, Fire, and EMS incidents. Calls for service for Fire and EMS are transferred to the Dane County Communications Center for dispatching of Monona Fire and EMS personnel. The Monona Communications Center advises Police of high priority Fire and EMS calls in the event Officer Response is required. Many of the business line calls include routine phone calls from citizens who are not only seeking police assistance, but also assistance with processing citation payments, requesting police records and general assistance. The dispatchers are also responsible for preparing and filing officer reports, citations, accidents, parking, UCR reporting and many other routine daily duties.

During the month of September, Dispatchers handled 925 calls for service. Most of these calls for service were received on the non-emergency lines, via personal reporting at the Police Department, transfers from the Dane County Communications Center or as self-initiated calls directly from Monona Officers.
