

**MONONA POLICE DEPARTMENT
MONTHLY REPORT**



NOVEMBER 2020

OPERATIONS DIVISION

In November of 2020, the Operations Division handled 14 vehicle crashes and issued 49 traffic warnings, 25 traffic citations, and five parking tickets. Our calls total for November was 694 calls for service.

Training

November 3rd Sergeant Winge and Lieutenant Wiegel attended an 8-hour Glock armorer recertification training.

November 19th Sergeant Nachreiner and Miya attended an 8-hour K9 recertification.

Speed Trailer

Security Checks

Officers performed 26 security checks in the month of November. A security check is when an Officer goes into a business and walks around to meet with staff to discuss any problems that the businesses are aware of. This also serves as a deterrent for theft. For the overnight shift, this entails checking the perimeter of the business and pulling on doors to make sure the businesses are secure.

Retail Thefts

There were 16 retail theft cases in November, down quite a few from the 30 cases in October. Around 40 cases are typical in a month. These cases can be time consuming if the suspect flees and follow-up outside the City is necessary.

Tellurian Treatment Center

In November, we had 6 calls to the Tellurian property totaling 2 hours of police time.

Use of Force Incidents

On November 1st, 2020 at midnight, an Officer observed a vehicle without a plate stopped near Wal-Mart. Upon turning to investigate, the vehicle rapidly accelerated away. Upon attempting to stop the vehicle, it ran a red light and the officer terminated the pursuit. (MO20-09727) suspect not identified

On November 4th at 12:19 am an Officer observed a vehicle with a 2019 expired plate. Upon attempting a traffic stop. The driver made an abrupt illegal U-turn at an intersection and rapidly accelerated away, running the next red light completely. Our officer terminated per policy. (MO20-09800) suspect not identified

On November 5th at 7:45 am Madison Police advised they were watching a stolen auto parked by the Monona Wal-Mart. The vehicle was stolen earlier in Madison and a handgun was seen. As Madison attempted to move in on the car, it took off. Madison used a tire deflation device and the vehicle fled onto the beltline. Our Officer followed the Madison unit. Eventually the vehicle stopped and the occupants fled and Madison Officers were able to catch the two occupants. (MO20-09828) handled by Madison.

On 11/07/20 at 12:40 am an Officer observed a speeding vehicle that came back as stolen. Upon attempting a stop, the vehicle ran a red light and fled at a high speed. The Officer terminated the pursuit. (MO20-09878) suspect not identified.

On November 16th, 2020 at 12:18 am An Officer observed a vehicle speeding on the beltline 90 MPH in 55 MPH zone. The Officer attempted to make a traffic stop and the suspect rapidly accelerated to flee. The Officer terminated the pursuit per policy but continued on in the last direction of travel. A few minutes later the Officer observed the vehicle had become disabled from running over the median. The Officer observed the driver fleeing from the vehicle. The Officer engaged in a foot pursuit and decentralized the male to the ground to secure him into handcuffs. The male became compliant at that point. The driver was arrested for Felony Eluding, Resisting Arrest and Felony Bail Jumping x2. The suspect had two open cases pending for Recklessly Endangering Safety and Eluding. (MO20-10096) M/B 42

On November 17th, 2020 at 12:09 pm Officers responded to Wal-Mart for a retail theft. The suspect attempted to run away from Officers and was tackled. The male resisted being handcuffed and a Taser use was threatened. The male was then placed into handcuffs. The male had a large folding knife in his pocket. EMS checked on the male and he declined transport and was taken to jail on two warrants, a probation violation, and a resisting arrest charge.

On November 17th, 2020 at 2:27 pm Officer were dispatched to an apartment in the 400 block of Femrite Drive for a report if three black males with guns entering an apartment. Upon arrival, Officers located the caller who advised two of the men fled on foot out the rear of her building and one was believed to be inside yet. Officers had firearms at the ready as she entered the apartment, but no one was inside. The victim stated the men took her designer backpack and belts. (MO20-10142) no suspects present

On November 17th, 2020 at 2:42 am an Officer attempted to stop a car for speeding 82 MPH in a 55 MPH zone. The driver then exited the highway and entered a residential neighborhood. The vehicle then attempted to elude the Officer by driving onto the City of Madison bicycle path. The Officer terminated the pursuit. (MO20-10157) suspect not

identified.

On November 20th, 2020 at 11:35 pm an Officer responded to the Avid Hotel for a woman stating she needed help. The Officer determined she was having a mental health issue and transported her to Meriter Hospital. At the hospital, the woman started screaming and threw a chair at the Officer. The Officer then attempted to place the woman into handcuffs and she punched the officer's arm twice. The woman then kicked the officer and he held her against the wall until security arrived to assist. The woman spit at the security officer. Hospital staff then entered the room and stated they could not assist the woman in her current state and she should be arrested for disorderly conduct. The woman was transported to the Dane Co Jail where the movement team escorted her to seclusion. (MO20-10191) F/B 27

On November 25th, 2020 at 6:43 pm Officers responded to Wal-Mart for an employee reporting an auto theft. Loss Prevention reviewed video and determined a different employee took the car. ON Nov 27 Wal-Mart called to say the suspect was at work. Upon arresting the female, she resisted being placed into handcuffs and in her attempt to pull away, fell to the ground. The Officer then secured her into handcuffs where she continued to scream and kick at the Officers. The female was transported to the juvenile reception center with charges pending for OMVWOC, Resisting Arrest and Possession of Marijuana. (MO20-10325) F/B 16

Citizen Complaints

There were no formal citizen complaints in November.

1st Shift Monthly Report

On November 17th, 2020 at 2:27pm Officer were dispatched to an apartment in the 400 block of Femrite Drive for a report of three black males with guns entering an apartment. Upon arrival Officers located the caller who advised two of the men fled on foot out the rear of her building and one was believed to be inside yet. Gunshots were heard by responding Officers, making the situation more intense, however, they were able to determine the gunshots were part of a military funeral underway in the cemetery nearby. At the renter's request, Officers entered her apartment and no suspects were present. The woman stated her designer bags and belts were taken. Officers found no evidence to confirm a crime occurred, and there was no further information available to follow up on.

On November 5th at 7:20am an Officer was dispatched to the AmericInn Hotel for a non-guest who was refusing to leave. The woman was surfing the internet on the lobby computer when the Officer arrived. The woman was known to the Officer as a chronic homeless person who frequents Monona. The hotel did not want to pursue any charges, they just wanted the female to leave the property, which she did.

2nd Shift

On second shift for the month of November Officers conducted 16 traffic stops, we handled 10 Retail Thefts, and 13 crashes.

The following are some of the cases second shift handled this month:

On November 5th at 3:30 pm Officers were dispatched to the 6200 block of East Gate Rd. for a fight in the parking lot. Upon arrival Officers observed a female walking away towards Fat Jack's. Officers learned that the female was trespassed from that property. It was also discovered that the female was banging on a window and kicking the door to an apartment. The female was arrested and transported to the Dane County Jail on domestic charges.

On November 25th at 6:43 pm Officers were dispatched to Wal-Mart for a stolen vehicle. Officers met with an employee who advised that his vehicle was stolen while he was at work. During the investigation, it was determined that another employee took the vehicle. On November 27th the employee returned for work. While interviewing the employee she attempted to flee and fought with officers. She was taken to the Juvenile Reception Center on several charges. The vehicle was located on November 30th near her residence.

On November 25th at about 7:40 pm Officers were dispatched to the westbound beltline near Broadway for two vehicles shooting at each other. Multiple callers reported this incident but also reported that the vehicles were going eastbound and one may have gone south on South Towne Dr. Officers from Monona, Madison, Dane County and the Town of Madison responded to the area. The suspects were not located and there were no initial reports of injury or damage. Monona Police were notified the following day that a vehicle tire was damaged after being struck during this incident.

On November 26th about 4:30 pm Officers were dispatched to the 6300 block of Roselawn Ave. for shell casings in the roadway. The caller advised that their neighbor's side of the duplex they lived in was shot up. The caller advised that the neighbor was not home. Upon arrival, Officers located numerous shell casings in the roadway. They also noted several bullet holes in the duplex. In speaking to the residents in the neighborhood it was determined the shooting took place the previous night or very early in the morning. This investigation is ongoing.

3rd Shift

During the month of November, third shift Officers for the Monona Police Department conducted 45 traffic stops, investigated two accidents, and responded to several disturbance calls. Officers had 6 different vehicles elude them after they attempted to make a traffic stop, leading them in a vehicle pursuit before officers terminated the pursuit.

On November 7th, 2020 at 4:54 am, Officers responded to a disturbance at an apartment complex on the 400 block of Femrite Drive. As a result of the investigation Officers arrested a 28-year-old male for disorderly conduct, 3 counts of misdemeanor bail jumping, and 1 count of felony bail jumping. He was transported to the Dane County Jail.

On November 12th, 2020 at 12:32 am, Officers responded to the 6200 Block of East Gate Road, for a 911 disconnect. Officers learned of a disturbance that had occurred at an apartment near this address. Officers cited a female who had been banned from being on the property for trespassing. Twelve minutes after concluding this investigation officers were dispatched to a disturbance at the AmericInn. Officers determined the same female had created another disturbance inside the hotel. She was arrested and transported to the Dane County Jail on disorderly conduct charges.

On November 16th, 2020 at 12:18 am, an Officer observed a vehicle speeding northbound on Stoughton Road from Broadway. Speeds increased from 60 mph to 120 mph without the officer attempting to make a traffic stop. When the Officer made a traffic stop the suspect vehicle attempted to elude the Officer. The Officer observed the vehicle exit onto Milwaukee Street, where it struck the curb, causing disabling damage to the vehicle. The male driver attempted to flee on foot but the officer was able to take the suspect into custody. He was transported to the Dane County Jail on felony eluding charges, 2 counts of felony bail jumping (one which is from another eluding case), and resisting arrest.

On November 16th, 2020 at 1:17 am, McFarland Police aired they had been in a vehicle pursuit with a vehicle last seen traveling northbound Highway 51 from Broadway. A Monona Officer observed a possible suspect vehicle traveling eastbound on Pflaum from Highway 51. The officer attempted to maintain visual on the vehicle, which had pulled onto Vondron Road where the officer lost sight of it. After the officer searched nearby businesses, he located the vehicle in the back lot of a mechanic shop. The suspect was taken into custody by McFarland Police Department and charged with felony eluding.

Current Investigations

MO20-10327 WEAPONS VIOLATION

Patrol was called to the area of HWY 12 and West Broadway for shots fired between vehicles on the beltline. Neither vehicle was in the area and we do not believe any person

was shot or injured. The vehicle tire of an uninvolved citizen was shot out during this incident but he and his passenger were uninjured. There is no suspect information and no current leads to investigate. This case will be closed unless further suspect information is developed.

MO20-10343 WEAPONS VIOLATION

Patrol Officers were called to the 6300 block of Roselawn Ave for a past weapons offense. A duplex was shot up overnight and neighbors did not discover the damage until over 12 hours later. The residents had previously vacated the premises and this is believed to be a targeted incident. Just under a dozen shots were fired at the duplex. The investigation is still ongoing.

Citation and Arrest Statistics

During the month of November, the Monona Police issued numerous traffic citations, municipal ordinance (non-traffic) citations, parking citations and warnings. In addition, there were many referrals for charges. See the detail below.

Each of the adult and juvenile arrests and referrals take at least an hour of the Dispatchers' time to complete the reports and intake paperwork for the Dane County District Attorney's Office. Once completed these forms and reports are reviewed by the Investigations Lieutenant before submitting them to the DA's Office. Each of these submissions is reviewed for referral to the Dane County Community Restorative Court (CRC). CRC is a program to address youthful offenders, age 17 – 25, with little or no Criminal History in a restorative justice model as an alternative to formal criminal charges. The CRC Referrals line above shows the number of Adult Arrests & Referrals who qualified to participate in CRC. Offenders who fail to complete CRC are referred back to the DA's Office for formal charging.

Dispatch

The Monona Communications Center answers business line calls for Police, Fire, and EMS incidents. Calls for service for Fire and EMS are transferred to the Dane County Communications Center for dispatching of Monona Fire and EMS personnel. The Monona Communications Center advises Police of high priority Fire and EMS calls in the event Officer Response is required. Many of the business line calls include routine phone calls from citizens who are not only seeking police assistance, but also assistance with processing citation payments, requesting police records and general assistance. The dispatchers are also responsible for preparing and filing officer reports, citations, accidents, parking, UCR reporting and many other routine daily duties.

During the month of November, Dispatchers handled 694 calls for service. Most of these calls for service were received on the non-emergency lines, via personal reporting at the Police Department, transfers from the Dane County Communications Center or as self-initiated calls directly from Monona Officers.
